Our first opportunity to share our stories occurred in March. The topic was our experience in confirmation class. We remembered the pastor who taught us; we remembered the size of the class, large or small; we remembered we had to memorize the catechism; many of us remembered being questioned to prove we knew our "stuff" and were ready for confirmation.

Perhaps your friend will share her or his story and you can have a wonderful time swapping stories of faith. Surprise! Telling your faith story is not hard, or scary, and it can be a lot of fun! Why not try it?

Ancient Creeds and Modern Affirmation of Faith

In the Wednesday morning class, we discussed the development of the Nicene Creed over the centuries. It was used to define the Christian faith, to settle controversies between what is true and orthodox, and what is false and heretical.

The Apostles' Creed has always been used as the baptismal creed. Its first written appearance is as a question and answer format in about 215. "Do you believe in ... ?" One question each for Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Updated English translations of the Creed over time have been used to help us understand the meaning of the Creed. For example, I remember learning about the quick and the dead, and the remission of sins. We now say, the living and the dead, and the forgiveness of sins.

In recent decades, there have been many new versions of the familiar Apostles' Creed. Often called "Affirmations of Faith," these new statements can help deepen our understanding of Jesus and our faith in him.

In the next few months, we'll include some of the new Affirmations of Faith next to the Apostles' Creed. You are invited to spend a few moments pondering how they help or hinder your appreciation for the ancient creed.

Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.
I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son,
our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
born of the virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried;
he descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again;
he ascended into heaven,
he is seated at the right hand of the
Father,
and he will come to judge the living
and the dead.
I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting. Amen.

Martyr Moment

Mikael Agricola

Born 1510-April 9, 1557

Mikael Agricola was a clergyman who became the *de facto* founder of written Finnish and a prominent proponent of the Protestant Reformation in Sweden including at the time Swedish territory, Finland. He is often called the "father of the Finnish written language". Agricola was consecrated as the bishop of Turku (Abo) in 1554, without papal approval. As a result, he began a

reform of the Finnish church (then a part of the Church of Sweden) along Lutheran lines. He translated the New Testament into Finnish and also produced the prayer book and hymns used in Finland's new Lutheran Church. This work set the rules that of orthography that are the basis of modern Finnish spelling. His thorough work is particularly remarkable in that he accomplished it in only three years. He died suddenly while returning from a trip during which he negotiated a treaty with the Russians.

Did You Ever Wonder . . . ?

Did you ever wonder what an altar is? The focal point of the church is the altar, the table of the Lord. More than any other furnishings, the altar symbolizes God's presence in His church. The altar is thus the symbolic center of the Church's life.

Regardless of its architectural style, the altar functions primarily as the Holy Communion table—the place where the Eucharistic feast is set and around which the family of God gathers for the feast. Every other function of the altar is secondary, and it is never merely a shelf on which book and other items are placed.

The term altar is derived from the Latin word *Alta*, meaning high, and the altar is usually on a raised platform known as the *predella*. Its height enhances its dignity and significance for worship.

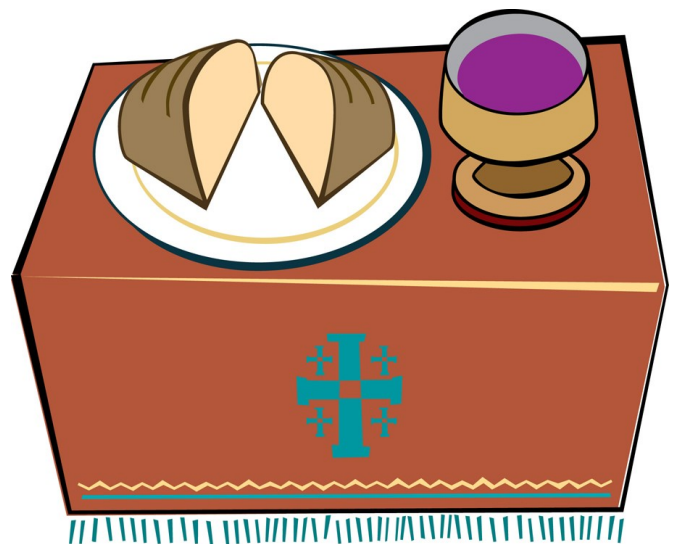
The top of the altar is known as the *Mensa*, which means table. Nothing is to be placed on the *Mensa* except altar linens, the missal stand, Eucharistic vessels and candles. Alms basins may be placed on the altar following the offertory.

Altars which are not freestanding often have a *retable*, which is a small shelf at the back of the *Mensa*. On the *retable* (which is sometimes also called a *gradine*) are placed the altar cross and worship ornaments such as flower vases and

candles.

A *reredos* is a high extension of the *retable* made of carved wood or stone which adds dignity to the altar. When there is no *reredos*, an ornamental cloth known as a *dossal* is sometimes used as background for a non-freestanding altar. At Hope, we have a freestanding altar.

Do YOU have a question that you would like answered? Deacon Diane will try to get an answer for you.

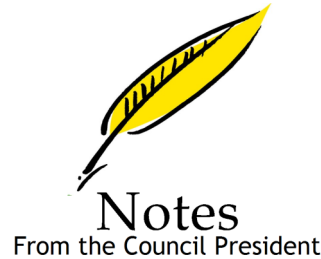
